# Lilies Available from Fall 1994 Harvest

PINK ASIATIC LILIES

'Aura' has pendant flowers of soft pink, shading into cream centers. This lily was bred by Charles Robinson, and it really prefers the colder Canadian climate and limier soils. It shows its Lilium davidii/pumilum ancestry in its many flowers, its grassy foliage, and its lovely long pedicels. 4', late June.

'Berry Ice' has luscious raspberry petals shading into an icy white throat, with a further splash of raspberry in its very center. 3', late June.

- 'Bonnie' has pendant, beautifully recurved flowers of unspotted pink. It occasionally produces a few spots when grown in full sun, but its luscious pink color always holds well. Leaves are broad and glossy. 4', late June.
- 'Center Stage' is a stunning new lily with huge pink flowers (with an undertone of peach) emblazoned with a dramatic gold star in the center. Strong, vigorous, and heat tolerant, it dazzles in full bloom! 3'-4', late June.

'Chippendale' (deep pink) and 'Rosepoint Lace' (ivory with rose "lace") are selections from our embryo-cultured Lilium lankongense hybrids. That gorgeous Chinese species has nodding pink-tipped flowers with delicately etched spotting, and a light fragrance, unusual in Asiatic lilies. It is, alas, difficult to grow. By embryo culturing, we were able to cross L. lankongense with tough Asiatic hybrids, producing the 'Southern Belles,' with larger and slightly open flowers. These were beautiful but still not as adaptable to garden conditions as we wanted. Backcrosses to the strongest pink and white Asiatic hybrids gave as the next generation: 'Chippendale' has deep rose pendant flowers, and 'Rosepoint Lace' has soft ivory to pink flowers, decorated with the delicately lacy spotting pattern from L. lankongense. Both strains have usually sturdy plants with heavy-textured, long-lasting flowers which are lightly fragrant. 4', mid to late June.

- 'Cissy' is a beautifully feminine lily with outfacing flowers of clear azalea pink, accented with a delicate white star in the throat, and embellished with lightly ruffled edges. 3'-4', mid to late June.
- 'Diminutive' translates the dainty poise, early flowering time, and long inflorescence (and thus the long blooming time) of Lilium pumilum into outfacing clear pink flowers with white centers. It is also lightly fragrant. It may reach 4'-5' and carry up to 30 flowers when established, and it often stays in flower for four weeks. Early to mid June.

'Dimples' is an early-flowering beauty with deep pink broad-petalled flowers with a wide, delicious cream/yellow "dimple" at the base of each petal. Lightly fragrant. 3'-4', early June.

★ 'Dreamy Pink' has large, upfacing flowers of luminous, silky, dreamy pink. Its color is pure, even, and non-fading. 3'-4', late June.

'Elf' is a marvelous hybrid from *Lilium cernuum*, a delightful but temperamental species. 'Elf' is blessedly immune to the diseases that plague Lilium cernuum, but it shares the charm and beauty of its many dainty, nodding, lavender-pink flowers and its graceful, grassy foliage. 3'-4', mid June.

'Extravagant' is new for 1994, with extravagantly large, extravagantly colored flowers of deep peachy pink with bronze-gold centers. It has an extravagantly long inflorescence to display each luscious flower to perfection and to assure an extravalantly long flowering time. 4', late June.

'In Love' is a glorious lily with many upfacing, shimmering rosy pink flowers with elegantly pointed petals. In hot weather, the flowers will shade into a lighter pink as they age. 4', mid June.

'Jolie' is surely as "pretty" as its French name. It has large upfacing flowers with mellow rose brushed richly on at the center, shading into heavy cream at the petal tips. The buds are deep rose, so the open flower is lovely indeed! 3'-4', late June.

'Leading Lady' has huge flowers of very deep rose pink, with the color deepest in the heart of the flower. 'Leading Lady' is our most "sun-proof" and our largest-flowered deep pink. Truly stunning! 4', late June.

'Luscious' has a tight inflorescence with many medium-sized starry upfacing flowers, with deep rose seemingly painted on and flowing onto its lighter center. The luscious color holds well in hot weather, and the high bud count assures a long blooming season. 3'-4', late June.

- Lyric' has a long, long inflorescence of many perfectly spaced upfacing flowers. Its mid-sized starry flowers are shiny raspberry rose. It remains in flower for weeks when established. 4'-5', mid to late June.
- \* 'Mayfair' has an incredible inflorescence of big flowers of "full blown rose," shading into a hint of coral in the throat. It has the longest inflorescence of all our upright pinks. What a season of bloom! 4', BEGINS to flower in late June.
- \ 'Ming Rose' has a sheen like the finest porcelain, and its glorious pointed buds, large starry flowers, and beautiful pyramid of flowers give it a distinctly Oriental beauty. Its "lacquered rose" flowers have tiny white pollen-free anthers. Heat tolerant. 3', late June.
- ★ 'Musette' is an early bloomer, heralding the lily season with a long display of many smaller, species-like outfacing pink flowers with white throats. Lightly fragrant, 3'-4', early June.
- ★ 'My Sweet' has upright to slightly outfacing "sweetheart pink" flowers, frosted with deeper pink spots, flowering a bit earlier than the mainstream lilies. 4', mid June.
- 'Passionate' has won hearts all over the world with its many glossy, deep raspberry outfacing flowers, enlivened by a tiny flash of white in the center. It has shiny black stems bearing loads of deep rose buds; it will flower for 4 weeks once established. 4', mid June.

'Peach Melba' has outfacing peach-pink flowers with delicately recurved petal tips, graceful strong stems, and an amazingly tough constitution--it easily withstands hot, dry summers and coldest winters. 4', late June/early July.

\* 'Pink Bamboo' is *new*, and we love its "two-tone silky" flowers of peachy pink, washed over softest apricot gold, accented with with delicately etched lines of tiny spots in the throat. Its upfacing flowers are carried on tall, graceful stems that remind us of stately bamboo. 4'-5', late June.

'Pink Butterflies' has many beautiful nodding flowers of soft delicate pink. It has the "old world" look of the species lilies, but it is at home in any garden. Light shade or a cool spot will intensify the delicate tint. 4', early June.

- \ 'Pink Halo' has huge rich pink upfacing flowers with snappy black spots, each surrounded by a tiny white halo. Its color holds well, and the large, thick-textured flowers last and last. Pollen will set seed on tetra Asiatics. 4', late June.
- \ 'Raspberry Butterflies' has pendant, heavily recurved flowers of shiny raspberry rose. It is exceptionally heat tolerant and disease resistant, too, and its grassy bluish-green foliage is striking. 3'-4', mid to late June.

'Raspberry Fizz' is a sparkling raspberry treat, with large up/outfacing flowers with lightly ruffled edges. 4', late June.

'Rose Bowl' has upfacing flowers with wide, round petals of deepest rose. It has shiny black stems and broad leaves. Exceptionally heat tolerant and disease resistant. Beautiful! 4', late June.

'Rosepoint Lace' (see under 'Chippendale' above)

'Sara Marshall' has a very long inflorescence with lots of outfacing flowers of deepest rose. It has "Mr Clean" anthers, too, that stay closed and make it superb in arrangements. It has beautiful black stems and stays in flower for several weeks. 4', late June to early July.

'Sheer Bliss' is new, the most fluorescent, intensely-colored, deep rose pendant lily we've ever seen! ("You would even say it glows!...") Its unspotted flowers are large, wonderful in form and texture, beautifully recurved. Strong growing and unbelievably elegant! 4', late June.

'Tenderly' has huge, long-lasting, round-tepalled flowers of tender, spun-sugar pink. Pollen will set seed on tetraploid Asiatics. 3'-4', mid to late June.

'Three Cheers' is a fabulous blend of three colors! Its deep rose throat is tipped by gold, which shades into the peach-pink that extends to its tips. Tall, vigorous, and heat tolerant. 4'-5-, late June/early July.

'Valentine' has slightly starry upfacing flowers of pure baby pink, slightly deeper in the throat. 4', late June to early July.

## PASTEL PEACH AND BUFF LILY VARIETIES

'Doeskin' has many Turk's-cap flowers of peach champagne, accented with cinnamon red anthers. It is a vigorous grower and a rapid propagator--plant a bulb or two, and you will soon have a colony! 3'-4', early June.

★ 'Dreamtime' is a taller hybrid bred from 'Doeskin,' with larger, more outfacing flowers of a deeper peach. 4'- 5', late June.

'Faun' has large, daintily recurved outfacing flowers of unspotted soft peach. Short and stocky, it is wonderful in containers. 2', late June.

'Mocha' is a tall, dramatic lily, with huge outfacing flowers of pastel mocha enlivened by a beautiful chocoate kaleidoscope of brushmarks in the center. Exceptionally vigorous. 5', late June.

'Molly' has silky upfacing flowers of a shimmering pastel peach. Gorgeous! 3'-4', late June.

'Rodeo' has large upfacing peach-buff flowers with lovely brushmarks extending from bronze freckles in the center. It will remind you of an elegantly groomed palomino ready for the show! The brushmarks are accentuated in full sun and less conspicuous in shady plantings. 4', late June.

- ★ 'Sugar Bear' has large upright flowers of palest champagne, enhanced by frosty white nectaries. It remains short and grows superbly in containers. 18"-24", late June.
- "Tiger Babies' is our most popular lily, and it thrives all over the world! This vigorous embryo-cultured strain combines the staying power of the old Tiger Lily with the size, substance, and elegant pastel tints of the trumpet lilies. 'Tiger Babies' have large outfacing to slightly downfacing flowers of pastel peach overlaid with a blush of pink, shading to a deeper peach throat. Stems are especially strong and carry a huge number of flowers when well established. 4', early June.
- \ 'Uncle Albert' has upfacing frosty flowers of champagne bisque, with a tiny lavendar "brushmark" at the base of each petal. Strong and reliable. 4', late June.

'Windswept' reminds us of the wind swirling through the "amber waves of grain." Its outfacing peach bisque flowers have deep amber throats and pollenless anthers. Very strong. 4', late June.

# WHITE LILY VARIETIES

- 'Brushstroke' is one of the most vigorous lilies ever grown, and it flourishes in every climate. It has tall stems with many large, creamy, upright flowers elegantly accented with rich plum brushmarks, making it a perennial show winner. In cool areas, the flowers are pale cream; in warmer areas or full sun, they are white. 5', late June to early July.
- 'Casper' has large outfacing flowers of pure, unspotted creamy white, sometimes outlined with a delicate lemon margin when it first opens. It has glossy black stems and dark bronzy buds for an exciting contrast. It also has anthers which do not open, an advantage in floral art. 4', late June.

'Elfin Bride' is a dainty upfacing *Lilium pumilum* hybrid, with its perfect diminutive proportions translated into a long candelabrum of unspotted creamy white flowers. It opens very early in the season and keeps blooming for several weeks. It has a light fragrance, too. 3'-4', early June.

'Moonrise' has upfacing flowers of shimmering silver-white, with a tiny necklace of black spots in the throat. Its inflorescence is a wonderful pyramid of many flowers! 3'-4', mid June.

'Ruffles' is unique, with pure white flowers which remain constantly and totally double. We have never been able to keep up with the demand for this very special lily, but our stocks look good for the coming year! 3'-4', mid to late Jun.e

- 'Silver Thaw' has icy white flowers with a glimmer of gold in the throat, and a tiny plum brushmark, as well. It suggests the first crocus peeking through the melting snows...beautiful and vigorous! 3', mid to late June.
- ★ 'Sparklers' has many outfacing, wide-petalled white flowers, with soft lavender spots. Its high bud count and heavy substance make 'Sparklers' a long-lasting attraction in the garden. 3', mid June.

'Tibetan Snow' creates a flurry in the garden, with many creamy unspotted Turk's-cap flowers--with no anthers at all. It has a long, well-spaced inflorescence and keeps flowering for several weeks. It grows well in every climate and makes a gorgeous contrast with bellflowers, delphiniums, or clarkias. 4', late June to early July.

'Vesper' has large, upfacing flowers of palest cream-white, and it flowers after most of the Asiatics have finished blooming, thus extending the season. In bright light, it may show a ring of delicate spots. 4', early July.

'White Butterflies' has many, many nodding, waxy white species-like flowers, often lightly flushed with pink on the tips in cool weather. The delicately recurving flowers are poised on gently arching pedicels as if ready for flight! Their long inflorescence gives a long season of flowering. 'White Butterflies' has all the delights of the species lilies but none of their fussiness or short lifespan! 4', early June.

'Wizard' is really dramatic, with large white flowers emblazoned with a deep black brushmark over a rich gold blush. What an eye-catcher! 3'-4', late June.

# YELLOW AND GOLD ASIATIC LILIES

'Bull's Eye' has large, outfacing, wide-petalled lemon yellow flowers, each with a beautifully brushmarked bronze "bull's eye" in its center. 2'-3', late June and early July.

- \ 'Caress' has out- to semi-nodding flowers with recurved petal tips. Flowers are soft, unspotted ciy lemon, with a beautiful pink reverse. 24"-30", late June.
- \ 'Citronella' has large, pendant, golden yellow flowers with many tiny black spots. Bred from Lilium davidii, this hybrid strain has dark stems and great staying power! 4', late June.
- 'Classic' has the grace, charm, and classic profile of the beloved lily species. Its nodding, clear lemon yellow flowers are slightly bell-shaped, like the lovely *Lilium canadense*; but this vigorous hybrid flourishes in real garden conditions and comes back tall and strong every year! It has a long, classical inflorescence, with pefect spacing of its many bronze-gold buds. 4'-5', mid June.
- 'Confetti' has vivid yellow flowers emblazoned with large, black brushmarks, making a wonderful focal point in the garden. Bright sunlight intensifies the brushmarks. 3'-4', late June to early July.
- 'Flirt' has all the coquettish charms, from its huge soft yellow flowers to its lightly ruffled margins to its delicately lined brushmarks. It is exceptionally vigorous and adaptable to every garden condition, and it increases rapidly, too. 4', mid June.

'Gaugin' is new, with big brilliant yellow flowers with the deepest truly red blush we've seen! It is a strong grower with a beautifully shaped inflorescence. 3'-4', late June.

'Hero' is a big, strong lily with enormous outfacing unspotted intensely yellow flowers, broad glossy leaves, and a hardy disposition. It never fails! 4'-5', late June to early July.

'Last Dance' was bred from late-flowering Asiatic lily species, and it bears many nodding lemon-yellow spotless flowers on long, arching, pubescent pedicels, often with secondary buds. We have had to use tissue culture propagation to keep up with the demand for this late-flowering, heat tolerant, tall and stately hybrid. 5', early to mid July.

'Magic Carpet' is a short, sturdy, "never say die" hybrid with large outfacing flowers of luminous, pearlescent yellow. It is wonderful in the front of the border or in containers. 2', mid to late June.

'Rapunzel' has an incredible inflorescence; when she "lets down her hair," as the fairy tale says, we may see 40 outfacing straw-yellow to light gold flowers in perfect array. The stems and buds are glossy laquered bronze. 4'-5', mid to late June.

- \ 'St. Patrick' has huge, chartreuse yellow, totally spotless, upfacing flowers carried on a superb inflorescence. 'St. Patrick' is a strong, vigorous, and wonderfully adaptable garden lily. 4'-5', late June.
- ★ 'Showtime' is one of our strongest hybrids, with huge outfacing flowers of brilliant gold, sometimes lightly flushed with red at the tips. It has unusually strong stems and broad leaves, and it loves a cold winter. 4', late June.
- \* 'Summer Song' is a gift to the garden, with huge outfacing to slightly downfacing spotless lemon flowers, in a beautifully spaced inflorescence. Its flowers have great substance and are especially long lasting. This triploid hybrid is fertile as a seed plant, a valuable asset to hybridizers. 4', late June and early July.

'Summit' was bred from the rare species *Lilium callosum* var. *flaviflorum*, from which it received its late flowering time, its unusual chartreuse yellow color, its dainty starrier flowe form, its tall stems, and is tolerance of summer drought. It resents overwatering. 4'-5', mid to late July.

\ 'Sun and Surf' has huge upfacing flowers that look like cups of sunshine! Each cup of shimmering soft yellow has a throat of apricot-flushed gold. GEORGEOUS flowers, big strong plants! 4'-5', late June.

### RED ASIATIC LILIES

- Beowulf is the deepest blood red hybrid we have produced, but still a rich true red--not a purple or magenta red. Completely sunproof in our climate, it is also very long-lasting. This lily drew raves at our summer field day! 3', late June.
  - 'Cherry Smash' is a vibrant cherry red upfacing lily which starts the season with a band! It has large flowers and remains "patio-sized." 3', early June.
- 'Cheyenne' has a long inflorescence with outfacing flowers of mahogany red, with a deep bronze reverse and with brony black stems. It grows well in a variety of climates, but its bronzy contrast is deepest in cooler areas. 4', mid to late June.
- \* 'Fireworks' bursts into a long panicle of tiny, spotless, pendant, fluorescent red-orange flowers. Strong, persistent, and utterly delightful in the garden. 3', mid June.
- 'Isaac Watts' wrote "Joy to the World," and this lily is a wellspring of exuberant joy in any garden. It has a long inflorescence of large outfacing spotless soft red flowers with "non-opening" anthers. It remains in flower for up to 5 weeks. 4'-5', late June.
- 'Kaz' was named for Dr. Kazimierz Mynett, a well-known Polish lily breeder who selected it as his favorite from all our red hybrids. It has a long inflorescence of many, many smaller starry red-orange flowers with no anthers; it remains in flower for several weeks. It is wonderful in arrangements, where it can take the place of miniature gladiolas or sprays of smaller orchids. 4'-5', late June.

'Ming Red' is NEW, with shiny, starry red flowers that truly glow when illuminated by the sun. Its upfacing flowers are laquer red on the tips and tangerine orange in the throat, with tiny, pollen-free anthers. Tall, vigorous, and heat tolerant. 4', late June.

'Nightlights' is an incandescent blazing red with a flash of gold in the throat. It has an incredibly long and well-spaced inflorescence, with up to 40 outfacing flowers. It blooms and blooms! 4', mid to late June.

'Razzle Dazzle' lives up to its name in every way! Its enormous, shiny, fire engine red flowers are carried on a huge inflorescence, supported by an exceptionally strong plant. It's a great natural propagator, too, so make room in the garden for an ever-increasing performance every 4th of July! 5', late June/early July.

'Red Artiste' is new, with bit, upfacing, fiery red flowers which display a beautifully-shaped ebony brushmark-star, outlined with a tiny gold margin. Bred from 'Brushstroke,' 'Red Artiste' has height and vigor in equal measure with its unique beauty! 4'-5', late June.

'Red Jewels' is our special strain of hybrids with *Lilium pumilum*, *L. amabile*, *L. callosum*, *L. maximowiczii*, and *L. davidii* in their ancestry. They have many lightly fragrant, brilliant red-orange Turk's-cap flowers, blooming early in the season. 3', early June.

'Viva' is in demand all over the world--it seems to grow well everywhere, with tall, graceful stems that carry a myriad of nodding sealing-wax red flowers. It often reaches 7'-8' when well established--and it is not difficult to establish. This embryo-cultured interspecific hybrid (*L. pumilum x L. maximowixzii* var. *unicolor*) won the Hornback Award from the North American Lily Society as the most significant advance in hybridizing the year it was first shown. We have had to propagate by tissue culture to keep up with the demand! 5'-8', late June.

'Warhawk' (Hoepner) is a brilliant red with tangerine throat. Its starry flowers have a sprinkling of jet-black spots; dark stems and deep red buds complete the drama. 3', late June.

# **ORANGE ASIATIC LILIES**

- 'Big Max' is a strong but elegant *Lilium maximowiczii* hybrid, with large, pendant, melon orange unspotted flowers. Its lightly fuzzy leaves and big sturdy stems give it a masculine air, but its beauty transcends stereotypes! 4', early July.
- \* 'Callie' has tall stems with long, arching pedicels, bearing lots of nodding, strongly recurved "burnt orange" flowers with delicately lined spots. This *Lilium callosum* x *Lilium amabile* hybrid is taller, more enduring, and has larger and more vibrantly colored flowers than either species. It loves a drought! 4'-5-, mid June.

'Clockwork Orange' has upfacing pumpkin orange flowers with dainty "pencil stripe" brushmark at the base of petal, forming a delightful clockface. 3'-4-, late June.

'Flagship' has the most intense electric orange color imaginable, spectacularly displayed in large, upfacing, broad-petalled flowers. It is short enough to grow to perfection in containers or in the front of the border, where it is a treat for the eyes! 2', late June.

Lumberjack' is a big, strapping plant with thick-textured deep orange pendant flowers. This polyploid begins to flower early in the season and keeps on for several weeks. It has black stems and delightfully fuzzy buds. 4', early June.

'Orangeade' bears large, broad-petalled, outfacing flowers of golden orange. It has a long inflorescence and keeps flowering for several weeks. Its graceful, sometimes arching stems and its tendency to "wander" in the garden come from its mother, *Lilium davidii* var. *unicolor*. 3'-4', early July.

'Orange Butterflies' is a strain of early-flowering orange Turk's-cap species-hybrids. It has a myriad of lovely little flowers which seem to hover in the air. Graceful and delicate in appearance, but vigorous and enduring! 4', early June.

'Party Time' has sizzling orange upfacing flowers with vivid purple-black brushmarks. Big flowers, rich colors, strong stems, and a party atmosphere--what more can we ask for? 4', mid June.

'Tangerine Treat' has huge tangerine-shading-into-red flowers with very broad, thick petals. It also has "clean" anthers of normal size, for perfect-looking but tidy flowers. 4', late June.

# TRUMPET AND AURELIAN LILIES

The Chinese trumpet lily species are the source of the huge, trumpet-formed, richly fragrant flowers in our seedling strains, which we are constantly improving. Adding *Lilium henryi* to the trumpet gene pool created the first Aurelian hybrids, with slightly smaller and more reflexed flowers, a later flowering time, a wider range of color patterns, and greater garden

adaptability. The trumpet and Aurelian hybrids have beautiful glossy purple bulbs which seem remarkably untroubled by soil-borne diseases and underground critters.

'Summer Palace' is our strain of pink trumpets, varying in intensity but always truly pink, with a deeper pink reverse. The pink anthocyanin pigment in lilies is affected by heat and light, with the richest coloring produced by cool temperatures and moderate light levels. 4', early to mid July.

'Winter Palace' is our strain of cream to white trumpets, with deep pink and bronze-pink reverses. 4'-5', early to mid July.

'Crystal Palace' is our strain of icy white trumpets with green throats and a white reverse. 4', early to mid July.

'Copper Crown' is our strain of copper and apricot trumpets with deep bronzy reverses. 4', early to mid July.

'Golden Sceptre' is our strain of deep golden yellow trumpets with deep bronze reverse. 4', early to mid July.

'Regency' is our strain of slightly shorter lilies with huge, slightly flared, soft yellow trumpets with a hint of green in the throat. Very fragrant. 3', early to mid July.

'Marie Antoinette' is our strain of Aurelian hybrids with large semi-reflexed flowers of ivory white, with deep gold or apricot throats. 4', mid July.

'Louis XIV' is our strain of tall Aurelian hybrids with large, reflexed flowers of intense pure yellow. They have the delightful soft bronze "whiskers" (tiny lines in the throat) of *L. henryi*, along with its wirier stems and its later flowering time. 4'-6', late July.

# **ORIENTAL LILIES**

The Oriental lilies are bred from the Japanese species *Lilium auratum* (for its huge flowers and silvery white and gold-banded colors), *Lilium speciosum* (for deep red color, reflexed flower form, heat tolerance and disease resistance), *Lilium japonicum* (pink color, trumpet form), and *Lilium rubellum* (pink color, shorter stature, and earlier flowering season). The Oriental strains are grown from seed, with final tagging in the field to assure the best in color and flower form. The clonal varieties include up-facing forms developed for the cut-flower market, ideal for floral arrangements and stunning in the garden! The Orientals love an acid soil and cool, moist summers. In less than ideal climates, these can be provided by shading, mulching, and growing in containers. Their enormous, ethereally beautiful flowers (8"-10" and even larger when well grown), their heavenly fragrances, and their late summer blooming time make them worth the extra effort.

'Crimson Dynasty' is our strain distinguished by its large, outfacing deep crimson flowers, outlined with white at the petal edges. The white outline varies in width, and the intensity of the crimson color is enhanced by cool weather and light shade. 4', early to mid August.

'Gold Dynasty' is our strain bred from the Gold Band Lily, *Lilium auratum*, but with a little genetic "extra" to give it more staying power. It has huge outfacing flowers of purest white, with a rich golden-yellow ray down the center of each petal. The center of each flower is lightly sprinkled with small pink spots. 3'-4-, early August.

'Pink Dynasty' is our strain with huge flowers of shimmering pure pink, varying from baby pink to deepest rose. Some have delicate white margins. 4', early to mid August.

'Silver Dynasty' is our strain with huge flowers of pure white, decorated with soft rose spots. This is probably the most peristent of the Oriental strains in hot growing areas. 4', early to mid August.

'Seven Dwarfs' is our strain of genetic "dwarf" Oriental hybrids. They differ in a single gene from the big Orientals, but this one gene gives them a unique charm and profile. They have shorter, heart-shaped leaves, flowers 6"-7" across and very fragrant, and heights of 24'-30". They include crimson, gold, and silver color forms. Early to mid August.
